MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS

- Bachelor (mandatory) and post-graduate (preferable) qualifications in law, economics, finance, development or other fields related to the extractives sector
- An operational knowledge of aid management and development policy
- Experience using Microsoft Word, Excel and financial management information systems
- At least five years relevant work experience, preferably more. Experience working for a development agency is desirable but not essential.

OTHER REQUIREMENTS

- A security assessment, including police, qualification and referee checks will be undertaken during the selection process.
- Hold or be able to obtain a South African work permit before commencing employment (supply proof)
- Valid passport as the position may be required to travel regularly outside South Africa.

SALARY

The salary level associated with this position has been benchmarked against the wider market and is competitive. The package on offer includes provident fund, medical insurance and performance-based pay progression.
